Welcome to the 75th edition of Secto Rally Finland.

Seventy-five years ago, a small group of Finnish motorsport enthusiasts dared to dream of a rally to rival the legendary Rallye Monte-Carlo. Twenty-six crews started that very first event in 1951, covering 1,666 kilometres and tackling just two special stages — one of them already in the iconic Harju, where our journey continues today.

Seventy-five years later, Rally Finland has grown into one of the highlights of the FIA World Rally Championship. This year our route features 20 special stages and 316.04 competitive kilometres, while the Jyväskylä Paviljonki Service Park once again serves as the heart of the event, welcoming competitors, teams, media and fans throughout the rally.

Following the success of last year's Super Sunday, we have taken the concept even further. The Himos-Jämsä Rally Arena will host the regroup, the spectacular flying finish, and the final podium ceremony, allowing spectators to experience the dramatic conclusion of the rally from one location. Overall, 66% of this year's stages differ from 2025, ensuring fresh challenges for competitors and exciting new experiences for fans.

As we celebrate this milestone anniversary, we are offering more experiences than ever before. Wednesday's opening festivities will honour the rich heritage of Rally Finland with a historic parade through the streets of Jyväskylä, featuring legendary rally cars and champions from past decades. Together with the City of Jyväskylä, we will bring entertainment to the Secto Stage at the Service Park, while the Finnish Air Force flyby and the Finnish Air Forces Big Band will add a unique ceremonial touch to our celebrations. Throughout the event, legendary Rally Finland winners will also join us to meet fans and support today's competitors.

Sustainability is at the heart of everything we do. In March 2026, Secto Rally Finland was honoured by UN Tourism as "The Most Sustainable Sport Event" — a tribute to the long-term commitment of our organisation, teams, volunteers and partners. Our 4th Spark the Future Sustainability Forum will bring together internationally respected speakers to discuss the future of mobility, innovation, high performance and sustainable leadership. Our popular shuttle bus network also returns, with new multi-stage routes making it easier than ever to enjoy more rally action while reducing environmental impact.

As always, our goal is simple: to deliver the world's fastest rally together with unforgettable Finnish hospitality — More than a Rally.

We look forward to welcoming you to Jyväskylä and celebrating 75 years of Rally Finland with competitors, officials, partners, media and fans from around the world.

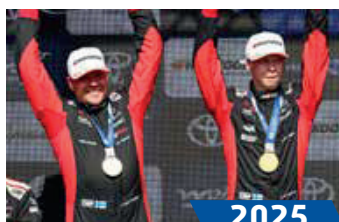

5. SERVICE PARK

5.1 LOCATION

GPS Coordinates: North 62° 14.271' East 25° 45.352'
Address: Lutakonaukio 12, 40100 Jyväskylä, Finland

As previous years, the Service Park is located in the area around the Jyväskylä Paviljonki Rally HQ and Jyväskylä Harbour. Manufacturers entered to the FIA WRC will have their designated areas in the Service Park according to the Championship Regulations. Auxiliary parking is in the parking garage within Service Park. Due to the restricted space in the Service Park, private entries will not be given any auxiliary plates.

Support Championship drivers and private drivers will find themselves inside the exhibition halls of Paviljonki Rally HQ. We do not encourage the use of semi-trailers as service vehicles (as they do not fit into all service areas as given in FIA WRC, Appendix VI), but do understand that many competitors have these. We urge all competitors with such set-up to be in active contact with our Service Park management as early as possible, and to take into consideration that the tractors will NOT be allowed to stay with the trailer! All payments for extra space as per Art. 4.4.2 apply and are payable prior to entering the service area.

5.2 GENERAL INFORMATION

The complete layout of the Service Park can be found as Appendix 4.1.

Final layout with competitor locations will be published on Sportity latest on Wednesday 22 July 2026.

5.2.1 Access

Manufactures and WRC Teams and nominated Tyre Supplier can access the area earliest on Thursday 23 July 2026. All other teams and competitors will have access on Monday 27 July 2026 at 9.00. Set-up for all competitors must be finished by Wednesday 29 July 2026 at 15.00 at latest, as the area will then open to the public.

All parties are kindly asked to respect these opening times. As there are other events in the area on the weeks leading up to our rally, please check carefully with Service Park Manager before trying to access the area before the times given. Manufacturers or Tyre Supplier wishing to bring equipment or sea containers to the Service Park area before the given opening time must inform the organiser thereof. If the organiser has not received such notification, we cannot guarantee any access to the area. All costs of moving the equipment either within or from outside the Service Park to its final position will be borne by the relevant owner of the equipment.

Rally 2 and Rally 3 manufacturers may require an area inside the service park for one (1) service support truck, to help their customers with spare parts and other assistance. A fee of 2 900 Euros plus VAT (25.5%) will be charged for this area, which size is 5 x 16 metres (semi-trailer plus tractor unit). Any additional services such as electricity, toilets etc. will be charged separately, all subject to availability.

5.2.2 General instructions

Competitors are kindly asked to remind all their team staff to always carry their Team Passes, as the organiser will be collecting an admission fee into the service park from anyone without a valid pass, and there will be no access to the area without a valid pass at any time.

It is strictly forbidden to wash service trucks in the area. See contact details for truck wash companies Art. 20.5.

There are several emergency exits at the Service Park, and those areas must be kept clear at all times.

Please note that it is absolutely forbidden to drive any anchors into the ground at any location inside the Service Park without the prior written consent of organiser's Service Park Manager. Competitors are reminded to prepare for fastening all structures with concrete ballast or equivalent. A list of minimum ballast for various types and sizes of temporary structures, as required by Finnish health and safety authorities, can be downloaded from <https://sectorallyfinland.fi/en/official-documents/> in the drop-down menu of Rally Guide 2. Our SP Manager may be able to help you in sourcing such ballast on location (if contacted early). Should the given prescriptions not have been followed, the authorities may require the structures to be taken down.

Teams located inside the exhibition halls must have at least two 6 kg fire-extinguishers ready and available at their service area at all times. A special location will be appointed outside the halls for any work which may cause a fire hazard such as welding. This area may also be used for barbeques. Minor fire work such as using angle grinders is allowed. The storage of gas bottles or indeed the use of them for any purpose inside the halls is strictly forbidden. Should you carry any with you on arrival, they must be left to a locked storage area outside the buildings.

During the night Service Park will be closed. Accommodation of team staff in motorhomes is not allowed inside the exhibition centre.

5.2.3 Leaving from the area

Please note that the service park will be used for the last time for the 45-minute flexi service on Saturday evening, after which the teams may start to rig down their service bays on Sunday morning after the last car has left the parc fermé (TC 18D).

As per Supplementary Regulations Art 12.21, all competitors located inside the Exhibition Centre must leave the service park with all equipment by Sunday 2 August 2026 at 22.00. For competitors in the outside areas, the same applies by Wednesday 5 August 2026 at 08.00. Areas must be cleaned and empty under penalty of a fee of 500 €/h charged by the Organiser. Before exit they must report to Service Park management.

5.3 OPENING HOURS AND PARKING

Service Park will be open for spectators as follows:

Wednesday 29 July	15.00-22.00
Thursday 30 July	08.00-22.00
Friday 31 July	09.00-23.00
Saturday 1 August	09.00-23.00

Teams will be allowed to enter/exit the area at times different from those above with their Team passes. The exhibition halls can be accessed via Door B.3, C.2 and D.1, which are manned 24/7.

During the rally only vehicles with affixed Service and Auxiliary plates will be given access to the Service Park. Auxiliary vehicles may only enter the Service Park to bring or collect personnel and/or equipment. During service halts, it is absolutely forbidden to drive in the Service Park area. All cars must be parked to dedicated parking areas.

Parking for Auxiliary, Rally HQ and staff vehicles will be located in the car park inside the service park. The car park will operate during the rally week as follows:

from Monday 27 July to Sunday 2 August after rally (until evening):

free access with organiser's car passes as given above, subject to available space in the garage.

There are some 300 parking spaces for the staff, HQ and auxiliary vehicles. Please note that the maximum height available in the car park is 2.15 metres!

Trailer park

All trailers and tractor units must be removed to a dedicated Trailer park area outside Service Park. The trailer park is located in Keljonkangas industrial area, some 8 km towards Jämsä from the service park. The address is Härkökuja 3, 40530 Jyväskylä (<https://maps.app.goo.gl/7jZwknr4wmznZzhE6>). There is no need for registration to the trailer park.

5.4 FACILITIES IN THE SERVICE PARK

The organiser will be offering the following facilities in the Service Park:

- waste collection for energy waste, bio waste, metal, glass, cardboard, plastic packaging, used lubricants, black waste oil, solid oil waste, brake and radiator fluids, aerosols, oil filters etc. Windscreens will be handled separately
- toilet facilities (inside the HQ building)
- portable toilets at team area (as per FIA WRC Regulations, Appendix VI)
- WLAN connection (cable connection available for Manufacturers by request)
- general security in the service park area
- car wash before the TC IN
- a washbasin and water connection for washing rims or any parts you wish to clean

5.5 SERVICE (FIA WRC, ART. 55-59)

There will be a 15-minute service after SSS 1 Harju 1 on Thursday evening. It will be preceded by a 10-minute technical zone. More information given in the Supplementary Regulations, Art. 12.9.1.

For the duration of the rally, there will be NO service in the morning between the overnight parc fermé and the first special stage of the day.

On Friday and Saturday, there will be a 30-minute mid-day service in the Service Park Paviljonki (no flexi), preceded by a regroup.

For any repairs prior to a re-start (i.e. after a retirement), please see the prescriptions of FIA WRC, Art. 55.

There will be no remote service zones or tyre-fitting zones outside the main service park during the rally.

Running of 45-min Flexi-Service

On Friday and Saturday evenings, the 45-minute flexi-service will be run according to FIA WRC, Art. 59. This means that the cars of P1 and P4 drivers will be driven directly from the 10-minute Technical Zone to the individual service bays, where the actual start of service will be marked on the timecard.

For all other competitors, the car may be left in the parc fermé after the 10-minute Technical Zone and taken later for the 45-minute service, or driven directly to service, when the service time starts from parc fermé OUT time control.

On arrival to their service bays, all drivers will be asked to be accessible to the public for autographs and photos.

Please see the details of Flexi Service at Supplementary Regulations, Art .12.9.2.

5.6 REFUEL

Please see the Refuel schedule of FIA fuel and the Refuel locations in the Appendices 1.4 and 1.5.

Refuelling before the event

Refuelling from drums and cans inside the service park is absolutely forbidden. All pre-rally fuel activities (i.e. emptying tanks of non-WRC fuel, refuel of WRC fuel from drums etc.) must be done in an area adjacent to the service park refuel zone marked in the SP lay-out. We recommend that all work is done during the RZ opening hours for the Shakedown. At all times, the competitor must have two 6 kg fire-extinguishers with operators ready with the car. Any such work may not be done within the actual RZ, nor may it disturb any refuel operations at the RZ.

Emptying and/or refilling the tank as part of service (FIA WRC, Art. 58)

The prescriptions of FIA WRC, Art. 58 apply, with the addition that all competitors placed inside the exhibition halls must have two 6 kg fire-extinguishers with operators ready during any such service. The organiser must be informed before starting the service.

5.7 ENVIRONMENT, RECYCLING AND WASTE COLLECTION

All competitors and teams are kindly asked to use the recycling areas arranged at the Service Park. The organiser provides waste collection services in the Service Park according to the requirements of local authorities of environment and waste collection.

NOTE! All waste must be sorted according to the type of waste. Types of waste collected in waste points of Service Park area, see Art. 5.4 above. All waste bins will be marked separately for helping the separation of waste types. In case of hazardous waste, please contact Service Park Manager. Read carefully the prescriptions of Supplementary Regulations, Art. 12.20.

All waste collection facilities in Service Park are provided to a common use for all and it is forbidden to change their places. If any additional waste bins are needed for team area's own use, they can be ordered through the organiser. Also in those cases, sorting of waste according to the waste type is absolutely required. Penalties apply as per Supplementary Regulations, Art 12.20!

It is absolutely forbidden to spill any oil or wastewater on the ground in the Service Park (ground sheets must be used at all times)! As per Supplementary Regulations, Art. 11.6, all competitors are required to carry on board an oil spill kit capable of absorbing all oil-based fluids in the car's system.

Before leaving the Service Park after the Rally (or possible retirement) each team must report to the Service Park management, who will check that their allocated area has been left in a good condition. If a team leaves without telling and the area is not found to be in order, Organiser will apply the penalty of a fee according the Supplementary Regulations, Art 12.21 and charges the team separately for cleaning the area.

This form must be filled in by the date given in Art. 3 Programme.

9. HELICOPTERS

9.1 REGISTRATION

As in previous years, the organiser will be working in close co-operation with the Finnish Civil Aviation Authorities. This means all pilots using the helipads provided by the organiser must attend the pilots' briefing and must acquire the organiser's pilots' pack, including all GPS coordinates, aviation / rally maps, list of helicopters and pilots and the necessary ID plates for the helicopter. Price for this package will be

In accordance to FIA and WRC Promoter guidelines on helicopter use, all helicopters flying in support of the Rally must be registered with the organiser. Please find the Online Registration Form at

9.2 HELICOPTER PILOT'S BRIEFING

All pilots wishing to use the official helipads of the rally, or otherwise fly in the vicinity of the special stages, must register to the organiser using the online registration form, the link for which can be found from our event website, under VIP/Helicopters section.

There will be two options for pilots' briefing:

- 1: Monday, 27 July 2026 at 17:00 (LT) online (Teams meeting invitations to be sent to registered pilots)
- 2: Thursday, 30 July 2026 at 16:00 (LT) at Jyväskylä Airport Terminal in Tikkakoski (for all those not in Briefing 1)

Be careful to fill in your correct e-mail address and phone number to your registration form, as organiser's bulletins will only be sent by e-mail. During the event, all the latest information concerning helipads or other important issues (e.g. WRC TV final locations) will be sent to the pilots as SMS. Make sure that all pilots' phone numbers are given to AirBoss.

The operators must be ready to present all necessary documentation at the briefing, as well as to send copies of the required pilots'/operators' licenses and insurance certificates already at the time of registration. Any late arrivals must be informed to organiser well in advance. Briefings will be held by the AirBoss.

9.3 RESTRICTIONS & INSTRUCTIONS

The pilots flying in support of Secto Rally Finland 2026 must have flying experience in excess of 500 hours or CPL(H) + 200 hours, and at least 20 hrs logged flight time in 2026. The organiser requires that only helicopters with a capacity of carrying at least 3 passengers (plus pilot) are to be used during the rally. All pilots must attend the pilots' briefing and register with the organiser. Identification numbers given by the organiser must be attached to the helicopter (1 pcs 34x50 cm to both sides, and one for front i.e. three numbers altogether) for the duration of the rally for identification purposes.

All pilots are reminded of the following:

- Please take a copy of your pilot's licence, medical and A/C documents to the briefing to be inspected by AirBosses / FCAA
- Please keep all your aircraft registration and insurance papers with you during the event
- Always prepare your mass and balance calculations before take-off, as these may be required by FCAA inspectors
- Check weather <http://www.ilmailusaa.fi/#> prior to any flight
- Do not Hot Refuel if procedure is not accepted by FTSA (Finnish Transport Safety Agency)
- In the briefing you will receive instructions for flight plans
- Advice by RTF of your intentions in helipads and latest 1 NM from helipads in English.
- flying over special stages below 1000ft MSL is forbidden to ensure safe operation of filming helicopter
- Use of helicopters anticollision, navigation and landing lights are mandatory, please make sure these systems are fully operational. Use of landing lights will be addressed on pilot briefing.
- Use SafeSky Anti-collision solution for traffic information

Only if these conditions are fulfilled may the pilot use the helipads listed in the official pilots' package. Also, please be careful to read the FTSA AIP Supplement from https://www.ais.fi/aipsup/AipSup_en.htm, where you will find this special AIP Supplement concerning the Rally.

The airspace around special stages will be a temporary restricted area, an R-area, and only A/C which have been approved by AirBoss may enter these airspaces. During active special stages there will be a member of the AirBoss team in busiest helipads to advice and inform pilots of air traffic situation. These advices and information is to be regarded as advisory information, PIC will at all times be responsible of A/C safety.

All pilots wishing to use the other official helipads of the rally, or otherwise fly in the vicinity of the special stages, must register with the organiser using the online registration form, which link can be found from our event website, under competitors section.

Inform organiser of all your privately arranged helipads! All private and exclusive landing pads must be informed to the organiser.

In all aspects AirBosses are the organiser's tool for better safety. We request that any anomaly or potential threat to helicopter activity will be reported to AirBosses. Traficom (aviation authority) will participate to the event with one helicopter and will be checking A/C and pilots during the rally.

9.4 DROP ZONE, OVERNIGHT PARKING & REFUELLING

There will be no DropZone at the service park / Rally HQ due to new buildings in the harbour. The Day Park in Kuokkala must be used for any flights to Rally HQ and Service Park.

Overnight parking is possible at DP (which is guarded overnight from Thu evening to Sun morning, 20h00 to 08h00) or Jyväskylä Airport, unless other arrangements have been made by the pilot himself. These must be reported to the organiser. Please note that you always need a permission from the landowner to land.

In Finland, you must always have the landowners permission to land. Should any helicopter land without such permission, the landowner may charge whichever sum he may see suitable from A/C operator.

Drones will not be allowed in the event airspace, except Organiser/Promoter and Police drones in coordination with Airboss.

12.1 REGISTRATION

Online reconnaissance registration forms (see link at Appendix 6) must be sent to the organiser as follows:

Date and time: Sunday 26 July 2026 21.00 at the latest

The same deadline is also valid for reservation of material collection time slot (link will be sent to all competitors when the online reservation system is opened). All reconnaissance and rally materials may be collected on Monday 27 July during your reserved time from the Rally Office, by a team member duly designated in writing.

12.2 RECONNAISSANCE GPS TRACKERS

See Supplementary Regulations, Art. 9.3.

12.3 RECONNAISSANCE SCHEDULE

Main part of the recce will be done over two days (Tuesday-Wednesday), only SSS Harju will be done on Thursday. The competitors will be divided into two groups (A and B) during the reconnaissance. The group division will be published in a Bulletin.

Reconnaissance schedule can be found as Appendix 1.3. The distances from finish to start are measured using Genimap GT Suomi Pro map programme.

12.4 MARKING OF THE ROUTE

All 5 km radio points will be marked on the route using miniature radio point signs.

Red and yellow turning arrows will be used in certain junctions considered by the organiser to require special attention. During reconnaissance, there will be red arrows on both sides of the road at the junction, pointing to the direction of the turn. In addition to these red arrows, there will be yellow arrows as advance signs 100 metres before the junction on both sides of the road during the actual running of the rally. Please note that these arrows are not used in all junctions, but the road book must be used to follow the rally route on the stages during recce.

The road book contains some comments to be noted during the recce. Maps for the recommended route from SS finish back to start include distances between junctions, and Road Book references where applicable.

Also, please note SR, Art. 9.2.2: Competitors are allowed to drive to the opposite direction of the rally in the following locations:

- a) for 1.52 km of SS 3/7 Saarikas on Road Book page 16, from box 2 to box 1. This applies ONLY for the liaison from the end of a crew's first passage to the start of their second passage. The route marked at the start of the stage must be followed to turn the car. After the second passage crews must use the route given in the Road Book from STOP control of SS 3/7 to TC 4/8.
- b) for 0.26 km of SS 4/8 Sydänmaa on Road Book page 21, between box 5 and box 4.

The reconnaissance of SS 12/16 Päijälä and SS 13/17 Västilä must be completed as a loop, starting from TC 12/16.

There is a KMZ-file under Protected Documents with the recommended/compulsory reconnaissance routes for your benefit. Entering and leaving the special stage elsewhere than through start and finish controls is prohibited.

12.5 PROHIBITED ROAD SECTIONS DURING RECONNAISSANCE

The following roads and pavements are not to be used during reconnaissance:

- the pavements used within the Paviljonki Service Park
- the use of any private roads which are not a part of the itinerary of the rally, for example taking a short cut through roads leading to private houses is forbidden
- route after Shakedown Ruuhimäki: do not turn right at RB page S5, box 10 – see route to SS Start from map on RB page S3B

Other useful hints and instructions for Reconnaissance:

Competitors using pump fuel during the rally should take this opportunity to visit the petrol stations they plan to use, in order to see the route and to estimate the time they will take for it.

The competitors are kindly asked to use the routes suggested by the organiser between special stage finishes and starts, see Art. 12.4 above.

The crews are not allowed to drive in the opposite direction of the rally on the special stages, unless given particular directions to do so by the organiser, their representative or the police, see Art. 12.4 above and SR, Art. 9.2.2.

12.6 SPEEDING OFFENCES DURING RECONNAISSANCE

During reconnaissance, any speeding offence whether recorded by SAS, police or officials on a special stage or on a road section, will result in fines levied by the Clerk of the Course, as per FIA WRC, Art. 34.2. The amount of the fine is unaltered by any fine that may or may not be levied by the Police. The fine is doubled for all drivers if a 2nd offence is committed in the same rally.

Please pay special attention to the speed limits of SSS 1/10 Harju (40kph) and SS 2/6 Laukaa (50 kph), unless a lower limit is indicated by traffic signs or signs placed by the organiser), also see SR, Art. 9.2.3.

Severe traffic violations, including speeding, during the reconnaissance or the rally, may lead to losing your driving licence. This may result in disqualification or refusal to start.

13. SCRUTINEERING, SEALING & MARKING

13.1 LOCATION

Scrutineering, marking and sealing will take place either in the Service Park (Manufacturer Teams and Junior WRC) or at Gradia, Wilhelm Schildtin katu, Jyväskylä (other competitors). Road book to scrutineering can be found as Appendix 3.2. Scrutineering flow is described in Appendix 4.3.

13.2 TIMES AND SCHEDULE

The cars of registered Manufacturer Teams will be scrutineered on Wednesday 29 July 2026 starting at 14.00 by engineering certificate only - for full schedule please see Official Bulletin No. 1. They will have their spare parts sealed in the Service Park Paviljonki.

Sealing and scrutineering for the cars and checking of safety equipment of competitors in the FIA Junior WRC will be in the Service Park on Wednesday 29 July 2026 at 16.00-18.00 in the order of the cars in their service bays. Drivers' safety equipment must be presented laid on a table, out of any bags or such, in order to speed the process.

For all other competitors, schedule for scrutineering (including driver's safety equipment, sealing of cars and marking of spare parts, see SR, Art. 11.9) will be given in a Bulletin.

13.3 PREPARATIONS FOR SCRUTINEERING AND SEALING

Read carefully Article 11 of the Supplementary Regulations!

In reference to the FIA WRC Sporting regulations, articles 16, 17 and 31 concerning the use of mechanical components, sealing and marking, all competitors are asked to carefully read these articles.

These regulations order competitors to prepare for sealing:

- turbochargers/compressors and air restrictors
- pop-off valve (if any)
- engine block
- all transmission units (front/central/rear differentials and gearboxes, the ones installed and spares - Priority drivers ONLY)

Additionally, for the purpose of controlling the engine block and chassis used during the rally, these will be marked on all cars.

This means that the competitors must themselves make all the preparations for sealing before arriving to the scrutineering, i.e. they have to drill the holes for the sealing wires and they must have a reliable wire installed in these holes. Wire shall go through at least a) two bolts or b) one bolt and one hole in the solid part of the item. The wire may be wrapped for a maximum of 20 mm after last bolt, and an excess of at least 20 cm of the unwrapped wire must be available (see picture in Appendix 5). This way the scrutineers only have to check the parts and the wires, as well as do the actual sealing. The sealing holes on the engine block (solid part in block) should be placed so that the seal is easily accessible and visible when opening the bonnet. If the sealing wires are not fitted correctly, car is not allowed to continue the scrutineering.

The pop-off valve will be sealed after the checking of the valve.

All underbody protection hindering these operations must have been removed from the car before coming to the scrutineering. Anyhow, these items must be carried with the car for the purpose of weight checks. If sump guards or shields hindering these operations are not removed, car is not allowed to continue the scrutineering.

- The sealing will be carried out during scrutineering
- Competition numbers must be attached to the cars before the scrutineering (NB! Please note the correct positioning of the number plates, see Supplementary Regulations, Appendix 4). See also 2026 WRC Sporting Regulations Art. 27 and 29.5 and Art. 28 for names and flags.
- Do not forget the Championship windscreen stickers, door panels and tyre manufacturer stickers supplied by WRC Promoter/FIA
- FIA watermarked & stamped copy of homologation form must be presented in the scrutineering. NB! Printed copies are not accepted. As an addition, the original homologation document of homologated rollcage must be available, with matching numbers. Special effort is aimed to rollcage structure and weldings (compliance with specs/drawings and welding of whole perimeter of the tube).
- Please note also the regulation concerning FIA protective padding on safety cage (2026 Appendix J, Art. 253-8.3 Drawing 253-68).
- Seat supports and brackets must comply with the homologation or App. J

- There will be a mandatory noise check at the scrutineering (maximum acceptable level is 103 dB at 3500 rpm). Cars which are over the limit will not pass scrutineering. Noise levels are monitored throughout the event.
- Silvered or tinted films are allowed on rear and rear side windows only (Appendix J, Art. 253-11)
- All cars having a non-standard catalytic converter must have the catalytic converter homologation document available at scrutineering.
- All driver's equipment must be presented in the scrutineering (also spare ones); NOTE! Embroidery, printing and / or transfers must be done according to the FIA Appendix L, Chapter 3 - REMEMBER to bring manufacturer certificates. Also, see SR, Appendix 5.
- Drivers and co-drivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2018 standard (Technical List No 74). Driver's equipment with the old standard (FIA 8856-2000) are not accepted. Also, see SR, Appendix 5.
- Please note regulation on safety fuel cells (Appendix J, Art. 253-14). Certificate of the FIA FT fuel cells must be available and ID label of the cell must be visible for checking the identity of the cell.
- Any national regulations which are not defined in the event regulations do not apply in this event
- Each car must have OK/SOS sign complying with the FIA WRC, Art. 53.2
- Please read carefully FIA Appendix J, Art. 253-13 concerning compulsory circuit breakers
- Please read carefully FIA Appendix J, Art. 253-7.1, 7.2 and 7.3 concerning extinguishers and anti-torpedo device; **NB! New for 2026:** All cars must be fitted with **two** fire-extinguishers in compliance with 2026 ISC Appendix J, Art. 253-7.3.2 to 7.3.5 or with FIA Standard 8865-2015. **Both** manual extinguishers must be High Voltage compatible (see Appendix J, Art. 266-23).

Please note that there is no time to fix non-conformities in the scrutineering, so make sure everything is in order when arriving to scrutineering! ALL repair checks will be done on Thursday morning, 30 July 2026 at 08.00–09.00. In case of any doubts, rather ask us before coming to scrutineering! Please note that the car must be accepted in scrutineering before entering Shakedown.

13.4 FIA SAFETY TRACKING SYSTEM

All competitors must carry an FIA Safety Tracking Unit in their rally car. SAS will distribute the units to all Priority drivers in their service area. Other competitors must collect the units from the SAS Workshop, located in Service Park, times given in Art. 3 Programme. Any damage occurred during the event will be invoiced afterwards.

NB! New for 2026: There will be an LED repeater unit in each car, see SR, Art. 11.8.

The installation and operating instructions of the SAS Safety Tracking System can be found as an appendix to the Supplementary Regulations on event website.

Should a crew retire, the equipment must be returned immediately to SAS Workshop. The units must be removed in the Final Parc Fermé and returned to SAS within 30 minutes after opening of Parc Fermé on Sunday, 2 August.

Competitors are reminded that penalties will be applied by the Stewards under FIA WRC, Art. 53.3.3, if the OK button is not pushed after stopping on a stage with no need for medical assistance.

All drivers / co-drivers listed in a bulletin must complete the FIA eLearning course and pass the assessment for WRC SAS Tracker by Monday, 27 July 2026 at 21:00. Instructions for the eLearning course will be sent to competitors by e-mail. There will be a drivers' safety briefing on Tuesday, 28 July 2026 at 19.30, concerning the use of the SAS tracking system. List of attendees will be published in a bulletin.

13.5 TRAFFIC INSURANCE

All competitors are reminded that competing cars must have an insurance that complies with the Finnish Insurance Code as described in the Supplementary Regulations Art. 5.1. The article demands all competing cars to have a third-party insurance which is valid on special stages. The organiser will have such an insurance available for cars registered outside Finland for the duration of the rally.

In order to be able to take this insurance for the correct vehicle, you must fill in the Tax Declaration form (RG1, Art. 8) timely by the 8th of July 2026, as the same information will be used for the insurance application.

If you have any questions about traffic insurance, please contact Rally Office.

13.6 FINAL CHECKS

The final checks will take place on Sunday 2 August 2026 at 16.30 in Gradia, Wilhelm Schildtin katu, Jyväskylä (see road book as Appendix 3.2).

For details, see Supplementary Regulations, Art. 15.

13.7 ONBOARD CAMERAS

All competitors planning to carry an onboard camera during the rally are called to read carefully WRC Sporting Regulations, Art. 18.1 and our Supplementary Regulations, Art. 11.11, and accordingly send all information required to the WRC promoter, as well as have the camera fitted in the scrutineering for safety inspections.

The official TV company may enter media zones, regroupings and the overnight parc fermé, as well as exits of refuel zones and locations given in a Bulletin to maintain the on-board cameras on condition that there is a team member present.

13.8 OIL SPILL KITS

As per Supplementary Regulations, Art. 11.6, all competitors are required to carry on board an oil spill kit capable of absorbing all oil-based fluids in the car's systems.

14. SHAKEDOWN

14.1 WHO MAY PARTICIPATE

Shakedown is open to all drivers according to the schedule given in SR, Art. 12.3 on Thursday, 31 July at 09.01–13.30 in Ruuhimäki. Non-priority drivers wanting to participate to the shakedown must inform the organiser there of using the Shakedown Entry Form found as a link in Appendix 6. All other drivers must participate as per FIA WRC, Art. 36.2.3.

Start list (P1 and requested drivers) for Shakedown will be published on Wednesday, 30 July at 18.00. Please see Supplementary Regulations, Art. 12.3.

14.2 LOCATION AND SERVICE

Shakedown will take place in Ruuhimäki, approximately 24 km from the Rally HQ/Service Park. The stage is 4.12 km in length. The service area is the same as in the rally, the Paviljonki Service Park. FIA fuel will be available in the Service Park during the Shakedown.

In addition to the main service park, the organiser will set up smaller service areas close to the stage. There will be one for the P1 entries, directly after the STOP control (Road Book p. S5, box 10-11) and another for the other competitors 2.5 km from the STOP control (turn RIGHT at Road Book page S6, box 13 and the area is immediately on the right). Competitors may only arrive to these locations with a service vehicle up to 8 metres long, as the space is rather restricted. Please vacate your place immediately after your crew has done the maximum two runs allowed.

More information about these areas, limitations of use and timing will be published in a Communication, see also SR, Art. 12.3.1.

14.3 GENERAL INFORMATION

Shakedown will be run like a special stage. Competitors must use helmets, overalls, etc., just as on special stages during competition.

Passenger rides are possible as per FIA WRC, Art. 36.4. Any person found onboard the car during Shakedown, who is not part of the entry for the rally, must sign a disclaimer which indemnifies the organiser. This disclaimer can be asked for from the Rally Office before Thursday morning. The passengers also need to comply with all regulations concerning drivers' equipment.

Please note that P2, P3 and P4 drivers, who are requested by the Promoter to do a promotional run, will be allowed an additional start at the Shakedown (SR, Art. 12.3).

15. START PROCEDURE

15.1 OPENING CEREMONY

An Opening Ceremony, featuring a special Anniversary Parade, will be organised on Wednesday 29 July 2026.

The assembly for the Anniversary Parade, which will consist of approximately 35 cars including all P1s and other invited drivers, as well as historic cars from different decades, will begin from Uno Savolan katu at 17:30. The parade is scheduled to depart at 18:00 and will circulate through the Jyväskylä city centre as a single, continuous convoy. The route is approximately 6 km long, with an estimated duration of 30 minutes. To ensure the smooth progress of the convoy, the route will be secured by traffic marshals and flashing yellow traffic lights.

At the end of the route (which will be given to the invited participants closer to the event), the parade will arrive at the Jyväskylä Harbour and will enter the Service Park via the normal TC IN. All participating crews must proceed to their service bays. Subsequently, autograph sessions will be conducted within each team's own service area.

At 19:00, driver interviews will begin on the Service Park stage (Secto Stage) according to the starting list published at 15.00 on the same day. Crews shall arrive to the stage on foot, as no vehicles are permitted in the stage area.

15.2 START OF THE RALLY

The cars will start from TC 0 on Thursday 30 July 2026 from 18.45 according to the start list published at 16.00 on the same day.

15.3 PROCEDURE & INSTRUCTIONS

The crews are requested to be in the start area max. 10 minutes before each car's individual starting time.

There will be no service between the start and special stage 1. A full set of timecards for the whole rally will be given at the collection of documents and materials, see Supplementary Regulations, Art. 12.8. Please see Road Book, page 0B for the location of TC 0 and the routes to be followed.

FIA fuel will not be available after TC 0, please see Rally Guide 2, Art. 5 Service Park and Appendix 1.4 TotalEnergies - Refuel Schedule.

16. FINISH PROCEDURE

16.1 OFFICIAL FINISH OF THE RALLY

The official finish of the competitive element of the rally will be TC 20C (Technical Zone & Parc Fermé IN - Rally Finish).

16.1 OFFICIAL FINISH OF THE RALLY

As per our Supplementary Regulations, Art. 12.16 and 12.17, the process for the podium ceremonies starts already from the STOP control of the Power Stage.

From the STOP control, all cars are driven to the Podium holding area and will clock in at TC 20A (Holding IN) and wait for further instructions from the officials. In this area cars are under parc fermé rules (FIA WRC, Art. 63.1.4). In the holding area all cars are neutralised and will be given a start time for the final road section to the finish of the rally by officials at TC 20B (Holding OUT), once instructed that they are free to leave (either when they have performed their podium formalities or it has become evident that they will not be among those receiving a trophy).

The winners in the overall classification will not stop at TC 20A, but will be directed to drive their car directly to the podium. Their time card will be marked by an official.

The crews will receive instructions about the details of running of the podium ceremony on location (interviews, trophies, champagne spray etc.).

Only the following crews will arrive to the podium with their car and drive it on the ramp:

- 1st in Overall classification
- 1st in WRC2
- 1st in WRC3
- 1st in Junior WRC

The crews will be called to the podium in the following order:

- 3rd Overall – 2nd Overall – President’s Medal – 1st Overall
- Representative of the winning manufacturer
- Forum 8 Most Stage Wins in WRC2
- 3rd WRC2 – 2nd WRC2 – 1st WRC2 – representative of the winning team
- FIA WRC2 Challenger Championship winners (if not on the WRC2 podium)
- FIA WRC Masters Cup winners
- 3rd Junior WRC – 2nd Junior WRC – 1st Junior WRC
- 1st WRC3
- Winning non-priority crews in classes RC2-RC4 (where applicable, see SR, Art. 14.7)
- Best Finnish Novice in overall classification

Having received their trophies and fulfilled any media obligations, the drivers will receive a permission to return to their cars in the holding area and start the final road section from TC 20B. The crew parked behind the podium will have their time card marked there by an official.

There will be short Mayor’s welcome on the road section to the final parc fermé (passage control at the City Hall in Jyväskylä).

17. PR-ACTIVITIES

17.1 VETOMIES - THE NATIONAL RALLY

One of the most popular side events of Secto Rally Finland, the “Vetomies” rally, will be run again this year, as per tradition. This event is a national rally, but open for both national and international competitors.

There will be a two-day event for both 4-wheel-drives and 2-wheel-drives. All the cars comply with Finnish national regulations, so they can't be seen on the start line of a World Rally Championship competition. Most of the cars entered in competition are Group F rear-wheel drives, so there will be some pretty impressive driving action out on the stages, guaranteed!

The Vetomies route consists of nine Secto Rally Finland special stages, starting from SS 2 Laukaa 1 on Friday morning and ending at SS 14 Leustu 1 on Saturday afternoon, i.e. the competitors run also on Harju 2, but before the WRC action, not after (or in between) like on the other stages. The total stage distance of the rally is 128 kilometres. The Vetomies prize-giving celebrations will be held at Paviljonki Service Park at 16:00 on Saturday, 1st of August.

17.2 RALLY FINLAND - 75 YEARS OF GRAVEL, HEROES AND TRAVELLING CIRCUS - EXHIBITION AT AALTO2 MUSEUM IN JYVÄSKYLÄ

The exhibition explores the founding of Rally Finland and its key stages and turning points across different decades. The Rally of the Thousand Lakes played a significant role in transforming rallying into the form for which it is known today: a speed competition based on special stages. In the 2000s, Jyväskylä had to fight to maintain its position as the rally's host city, but ultimately retained its status.

The exhibition focuses primarily on the history of the event itself. Although the rally has travelled throughout Finland, reaching as far as Lapland, this exhibition concentrates on its home city. Photographs illustrate how the rally has looked in Jyväskylä and the Central Finland region during different eras. The images capture the atmosphere of their time through cars, buildings, and people.

The same factory chimney stood in Lutakko, Jyväskylä, in the 1950s, when driving skill competitions were held there as part of the Rally of the Thousand Lakes, and it was still there in the 2000s when the rally headquarters was established around the Paviljonki exhibition and congress centre in Lutakko.

Among the rally's most important venues in Jyväskylä are Harju, where special stages have been run since the 1950s, and Laajavuori, which served as the heart of the rally from the 1970s through the 1990s.

The exhibition demonstrates how the Rally of the Thousand Lakes helped make Central Finland Finland's rally region. Without the event, it is unlikely that Central Finland would have produced three Finnish World Rally Champions. Juha Kankkunen became world champion in the 1980s, Tommi Mäkinen in the 1990s, and Kalle Rovanperä in the 2020s.

Central Finland's status as a rally region was strengthened further when Toyota returned to the World Rally Championship and began building its rally cars in Jyväskylä in the 2010s.

Above all, however, Central Finland is a rally region because of its people. The spectators have always been here. So have the volunteers, without whom neither small nor large events could be organised. Landowners,

road associations, and other stakeholders have generally supported the staging of the rally.

The exhibition highlights rally spectators and volunteers, as well as key figures from the organising side during the Rally of the Thousand Lakes era.

Naturally, rallying is not everyone's passion. Anti-rally demonstrations have become an established part of rally week events in Jyväskylä, and the exhibition also presents critical perspectives on the event.

Objects form a central part of the exhibition. Visitors will be able to see the first prize awarded at the inaugural 1951 Rally of the Thousand Lakes, the rally's travelling trophy from the 1950s, Kalle Rovander's first racing overalls, a rally-themed leather briefcase belonging to the event's founder Pentti Barck, the contents of co-driver Jone Halttunen's travel case from rally trips, fan mail received by Tommi Mäkinen, and the pace-note notebook from Juha Kankkunen's first Rally of the Thousand Lakes.

Videos illustrate how the nature of rallying has evolved from the 1950s to the present day. Numerous interviews have also been conducted specifically for the exhibition. The voices heard range from world champions to amateur rally enthusiasts. It is precisely the fact that the Rally Finland brings both groups together that makes it such a great sporting celebration.

17.3 RALLY HALL OF FAME

The Rally Museum will organize a special exhibition of four rally cars at the Secto Rally Finland service park during the FIA World Rally Championship event from July 29 to August 2, 2026, celebrating the long history of the Jyväskylä Rally. The exhibition will feature four iconic cars from different eras: a 1965 Mini Cooper S, driven by Timo Mäkinen to victory in Jyväskylä in 1965; a 1973 Ford Escort, a replica of Timo Mäkinen's winning car; a 1983 Audi Quattro A2, a replica of Hannu Mikkola's winning car; and a 2017 Toyota Yaris WRC, an authentic Toyota Gazoo Racing competition car.

The exhibition area will also present the history and rally careers of the three new inductees to the Rally Museum Rally Hall of Fame for 2026. The names of this year's inductees will be announced in the Secto Rally Finland Spectator Guide, published on July 13, 2026.

17.4 CHARITY GOLF

As a part of the Secto Rally Finland 75th Anniversary and our ongoing sustainability work, we warmly invite all our stakeholders to join us in doing good through the official Charity Golf event. The event will take place at the Laukaan Peurunkagolf course on Monday, July 27th, with the first tee time starting at 14:00. The game format is a 9-hole, two-person scramble, and all donation funds will be directed to local gender equality and diversity initiatives.

17.5 AKK MOTORSPORT AREA

The year 2026 marks not only the anniversary of Secto Rally Finland but also that of AKK Motorsport Ry. The Finnish Automobile Sport Federation will participate in the official side program of Secto Rally Finland with its own presentation area.

The event area will be located indoors, immediately after the entrance to hall B. At the AKK Motorsport Ry's exhibition area in Pavilion B, history meets the present. Spectators will find vehicles from various motorsports disciplines, ranging from cross-karts to Formula cars throughout history. In addition, the booth

offers motorsports training activities like reaction games, a driving simulator and physical fitness tests for motorsports athletes. The fitness tests will be provided by the KIHU—the Elite Sports Institute.

In collaboration with the motorsports clubs affiliated with the federation, AKK Motorsport Ry is also organizing low-threshold test drives throughout the Service Park area with racing simulators, RC cars, slot cars, and micro karts. The AKK-Motorsport sections will present different forms of low-threshold motorsports with the aim to inspire new target groups to explore the possibilities of the sport, both as a hobby and as a career path.

17.6 SERVICE PARK ACTIVITIES DURING THE EVENT

In collaboration with the motorsports clubs affiliated with the AKK Motorsport Ry, there are various low-threshold motorsports activities throughout the Service Park area including racing simulators, slot cars, RC cars, and micro karts. All the areas are open to public from Wednesday to Saturday.

At the hall B, inside the Paviljonki spectators can find the racing simulators and slot cars. With the racing simulators the spectators can try to beat the fastest WRC drivers in a simulator race or compete against friends and family members during the weekend (there are also simulators for kids available). Simulator area is located inside the exhibition halls of Paviljonki, at the Hall B. Right beside the simulators there is also a track for slot cars at hall B.

In the outdoor area of the service park, the fan zone, spectators will find a micro-cart track and an outdoor track for RC cars. The youngest members of the family can get a real taste of driving on the micro kart track, where they'll put on real racing gear and hop behind the wheel. At the RC car track, spectators can see for themselves how these high-speed RC cars handle on the pavilion's asphalt.

On top of all this, there are plenty of other small activities and interactive experiences organized by our partners at various locations throughout the service park area, not to mention the fan merchandise shops. In addition, the Secto Stage will feature a variety of interesting interviews and events throughout the entire event.

17.7 FINNISH AIR FORCE - AIRFORCE BIG BAND AND MIDNIGHT HAWKS

Visitors are warmly welcome to explore the Finnish Air Force's equipment and operations at the Secto Rally Finland Service Park throughout the rally week.

The programme begins on Wednesday afternoon with a performance by the Finnish Air Force Big Band featuring guest vocalist Emma Balbatsu. Following the concert, the Midnight Hawks aerobatic display team will take to the skies for an introductory show on Wednesday, 29 July, at 17:35. After the show, the team will perform a flypast over Jyväskylä before returning to its home base in Tikkakoski.

The Air Force exhibition area in the Service Park will showcase Defence Forces transport equipment as well as information on selected Air Force training programmes and specialist courses.

Air Force logistics experts based in Tikkakoski are responsible for aircraft refuelling operations and support the nationwide transportation needs of the Jyväskylä Garrison, among many other tasks. Tikkakoski is also home to the Headquarters of the Finnish Air Force and serves as the Air Force's main operating base.

19. MEDICAL & SAFETY SERVICE

19.1 MEDICAL INFORMATION

At the administrative checks before the rally all drivers must present their Medical Certificate of Aptitude in accordance with the FIA medical standards, and as given to them by their own ASN. Normally this Medical Certificate of Aptitude is included in the International Competition License, but if it is not, the (co-)driver is responsible to present a separate document.

A decision in accordance with Finnish law has been taken by the Health Care District Central Finland that an individual living elsewhere than in Finland must pay the total cost of treatment received unless other provision has been made in international agreements.

All drivers are reminded of FIA WRC, Art. 2.5: When competing outside their countries, crews must have taken out on international insurance policy covering their repatriation, if necessary, after an accident.

Residents of EU / EEA / and Switzerland

By presenting your European Health Insurance Card, you will receive medical treatment on the same terms as the local residents. However, not all doctors and hospitals operate within the reimbursement system, which means that any costs you incur outside the system will have to be paid by yourself. As a general rule, public health services are covered by the reimbursement system.

The European Health Insurance Card mainly covers emergency treatment in the event of an illness or injury and other medically necessary treatment. You can also get medical treatment if you have a pre-existing chronic condition that requires medical attention while you are abroad.

Please contact your national health insurance authorities to get your card before travelling to Finland.

Residents of other countries

If you are a resident of a country other than those mentioned above, the patient charge will be the equivalent of the total cost of treatment plus the patient charge for an individual living in Finland.

Payment of the patient charge

If you require first aid, collection of the patient charge will be made as you leave hospital. Collection of the charge will take place in advance in cases where you have agreed with the hospital on treatment that is not urgent.

Should an insurance institution be responsible for your patient charges, acceptable evidence of this must be presented to the hospital.

All competitors living in the European Community should organise themselves a European Health Insurance Card to be able to get free medical services at the communal health care centres and hospitals. This card can be obtained from your local social services.

Medical Service in Service Park Paviljonki

Service Park Medical Centre is marked on the service area map with a cross symbol. A doctor will be present during the opening hours of the service park with medical staff in attendance. This medical unit will help you with any medical problems you may have or organise transportation to further treatment

when necessary. Our ambulance will respond to any accidents that may occur in your service areas. The unit will be open as follows:

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20. GENERAL FACTS AND INFO

20.1 GENERAL FACTS ABOUT FINLAND

Population

5.653 million, giving an average density of only 18.6 per sq. kilometre; annual growth rate 0.127%. Life expectancy 82.48 years. The demographic pyramid resembles that of most other industrial countries, with the middle-aged groups predominating. Average household sizes 2.7 persons. 45,9% of the population live in single-family houses, 46% in apartment blocks; room area per person 36 sq. metres. 85.6% are urban-dwellers, with 1.3 million in Helsinki and the adjacent cities of Espoo and Vantaa. Other major cities include Tampere, Oulu, Turku, Jyväskylä, Lahti, Kuopio, Kouvola and Rovaniemi.

Area

338,472 sq. kilometres, of which 11.3% is water. There are more than 168 000 lakes in Finland. 7% of the land is under cultivation, barley and oats being the main crops. Forests (mainly pine and spruce) cover 76% of the country.

Climate

The Finnish climate is considerably milder than one might expect from the country's northerly location. There are major variations in the seasons. During the rally, it is late summer and weather may vary quite a lot. It can be sunny and over 20 degrees Celsius or it can rain a lot.

Time zone

Finnish time is two hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT +2 hours). Daylight saving time is used from the last Sunday of March to the last Sunday of October.

Traffic Rules

- Drive on the right side, overtake on the left
- Drivers and all passengers are required to use front and rear seat belts and motorcyclists to wear helmets
- Vehicles must always use lights when driving
- Drivers must carry their driving license at all times
- Pedestrians who are on a crosswalk or preparing to step onto it must be allowed to proceed unimpeded. The vehicle must slow down and, if necessary, stop before the pedestrian crossing.

Speed Limits

- Built up areas and cities 50 km/h (if not marked lower)
- Main Roads 80 km/h (if not marked lower)
- Motorways 100 or 120 km/h

Currency and Banking

The Finnish currency unit is euro (€ or EUR), divided into 100 cents.

The denominations in circulation are:

- Notes - 500, 200, 100, 50, 20, 10 and 5 euros
- Coins - 2 and 1 euros; 50, 20, 10 and 5 cents (2 and 1 cent coins not in active use in Finland).

We recommend to check current exchange rates from dedicated websites.

Automatic Teller Machines

There are several cash dispensers all over the city. They usually operate on Visa/Eurocard. From the ATMs you can withdraw notes in denominations of 20 and 50 €. The closest cash dispenser to the Rally HQ is in Matkakeskus (the railway station). You can recognise the ATMs from an orange sign "OTTO." or a yellow/blue sign "NOSTO".

Credit Cards

All major credit cards are very widely accepted in hotels, car rental offices, department stores, restaurants, shops and most taxis. Foreign credit cards can be used to withdraw cash from almost all ATMs.

Medical Services

Medicines are sold at pharmacies (APTEEKKI). Usually pharmacies are open until 17.00 or 18.00. There is one pharmacy (Yliopiston Apteekki) at Kauppakatu 39, which is open daily 08.00 – 23.00.

All hospitals have doctors on duty around the clock. In emergencies, patients should be directed to a health care centre or hospital emergency unit. Dental care is mainly provided by private practitioners.

Water

The tap water is safe to drink.

Electricity

The electric current in Finland is 230 Volts. Plugs and sockets are the same as in the continental countries of the European Union.

Telephones

There are pre-paid SIM cards available for your GSM mobile phones at 'R-Kioski' in various values.
